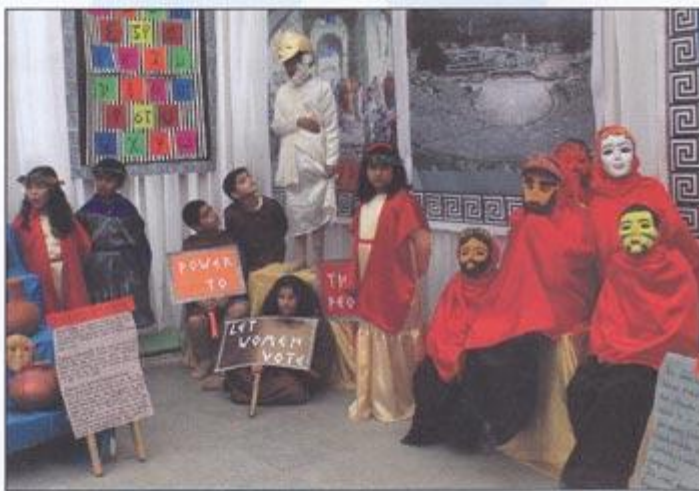

SOULFUL ENGLISH

The world is becoming a smaller place to live in and language is the 'precious connecting string'. The main idea of the Project Soulful English was to immerse the students in the 'Sea of Literature'. A plethora of activities were organized class-wise - **Class VI** - Making a cartoon strip; **Class VII and VIII** - Poetry Illustration; **Classes IX and X** - Poetry Dramatization; **Class XI** - Quiz on Shakespeare. In addition to these, Book cover designing, learning use of idioms and phrases, Story-telling sessions by eminent personalities were also conducted. WORLD EXPLORER

As a part of ISA Activity – World Explorer Project various activities were undertaken for different classes :

a) Psephology Group (for Class VII): A PPT on the 'Types of Parliament in the world and their Election Processes' was prepared. Students also enacted as important leaders of the world and delivered their speeches in different languages.

b) Economic Group (for Class XI): Students went for a field trip to 'Craft Market' – Delhi Haat. They conducted a survey to collect data and information on the 'Owners of Small Scale Industries' and took interviews of different people. They also did comparative studies.

c) On line Project on British Council Site (Class VIII – X) - **(1)** A PPT based on weather and climate of India showing various seasons and their causes for their occurrence was prepared by the students. **(2)** They collected climatic data of 2012-13 and presented it graphically. **(3)** They made a Documentary film on 'Climatic Conditions of Egypt' and 'The effect of climate on Flora of Pakistan'. A Quiz based on Flora and Fauna of India and other countries of the world was conducted.

INDIA EDUCATION SUMMIT

India Education Summit - 2014 was organised on 6th March at Taj Mansingh in Delhi. **Vice Principal, Ms. Alka Kher** represented the school for the most debatable topic on Education Reforms and the Quest for Excellence. Eminent Speakers like Dr. Shashi Tharoor (Minister of State - Ministry of HRD), Mr. A. R. Kohli (Former Governor - State of Mizoram), Prof. Amitabh Mattoo (Director - Australia India Inst.), Dr. Devi Singh (Director IIM - Lucknow), Prof. P. B. Sharma (Vice Chancellor - Delhi Technological University), Prof. H. S. Srivastava (Former Dean NCERT) and Dr. Shyama Chona (Ex. President DPS, R.K.Puram) were present and they expressed their views on the various educational policies and the use of technology in teaching. Piezo Electricity - Why waste energy?

The law of conservation of energy says that energy can neither be created nor destroyed; all we can do is to convert it. It is because of this law that solar energy, tidal hydro and wind energy are used for meeting our energy requirements, mainly for generating electricity. Wait! Heat, tidal power etc. are fine, but are we making judicious use of Kinetic Energy produced by us as a by-product? 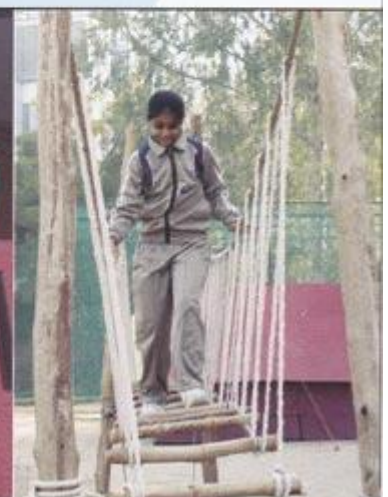

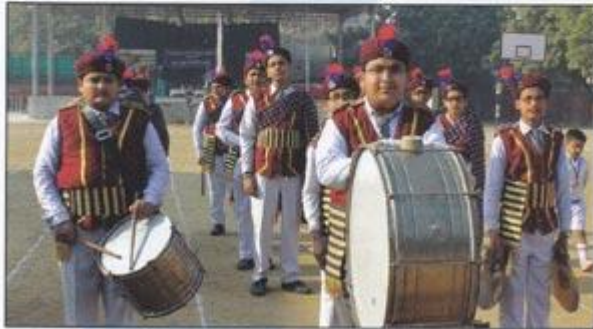
