Our school renewed their ties with their old companion country Lithuania, during their second phase of Indo-Lithuanian Cultural Exchange Programme marked by the visit to their school - Liezdeka's Gymnazija, Radviliskis, Lithuania from 25 Sept to 01 Oct '16. Before their visit to Lithuania, on 5 September 2016, our school Manager Mr. Rahul Aggarwal, two teachers of our school, Ms. Ritu Khurana and Ms. Anushree Ghai alongwith twelve students, viz. The purpose of the visit was to attend the Orientation program planned by Lithuanian Ambassador, Mr. Laimonas Talat-Kelpsa. The Orientation was towards developing an understanding of their country, Lithuania in terms of its history, culture, people, infrastructure, job and educational opportunities. Apart from the Ambassador, other members of the Embassy were also present and the meeting helped build healthy relationship between us.

The Indian delegation was led by our School Manager and were given a warm welcome by the host school's Principal Ms. Ira Bajarauskaite, Vice Principal Ms. Skirma Petraitiene and also by the host families. Mr. Rahul Aggarwal had a formal interaction with the Vice Mayor of the district in Municipality office to know about municipalities functioning in general. Various activities were planned which included the celebration of 'European Day of Languages', where the students from many other countries visiting Liezdeka joined the celebrations. Presentations were made from both the sides about their respective countries, students from Liezdeka also gave a music and dance performance. The Exchange Programme included city tours. The visit to their youth centre and Burbiskio enriched their knowledge about the place with Polish Lithuanian history. It was followed by a sightseeing tour to a fully restored 19th century manor, which is an important heritage site. The Indian delegation also visited Hill of Crosses, Trakai Island Castle and Old Capital Kernave. The main project of this Cultural Exchange Programme was the rituals attached to native weddings. Our students explained the concepts involved in Indian weddings through enactments alongwith PowerPoint Presentations. The students also participated in Language classes and were quick learners of their art and dance too. Both schools had an amazing experience and parted with a promise to meet again."

### **DILLI DARSHAN**

Our school organised educational excursion 'Dilli Darshan' for students of Class III, Class IV and Class V on 8 September, 4 November and 15 November respectively. Class IV itinerary for 'Dilli Darshan' included Red Fort, Bangla Sahib, Sacred Heart Cathedral and Birla Mandir. The aim of the tour was to acquaint the students with one of the most valuable heritage site, from where our Prime Minister addresses the nation on 15 August every year and about various religions and the religious practices followed. The visit to religious places helped in emphasising on the idea of India being a secular country where multiple religions are followed

and given equal importance. Students of Class III and Class V visited places of tourist attraction. The main aim of this 'Dilli Darshan' was to introduce our young pupils to our city's proud heritage. The day started with a visit to the historical Qutub Minar. Students were absolutely amazed to see the tallest brick minaret in the world. They learnt about its history and architecture. The next stop was the beautiful Lotus temple, which is a Bahá'í House of Worship completed in 1986. The architecture is notable for its lotus flowerlike shape, composed of 27 free-standing marble-clad "petals" arranged in clusters of three to form nine sides, with nine doors opening onto a central hall with height of slightly over 40 metres and a capacity to accommodate 2,500 people. The final stop was at the prominent landmark of Delhi - the India Gate. It is a war Memorial designed by Edwin Lutyens, located astride the Rajpath, on the eastern edge of the 'ceremonial axis', formerly called Kingsway. India Gate is a memorial to 82,000 soldiers of the undivided Indian Army, who died in the period 1914–21, during the First World War, in France, Flanders, Mesopotamia, Persia, East Africa, Gallipoli and elsewhere in the Near and the Far East, and the Third Anglo-Afghan War. 13,300 servicemen's names inscribed on the gate, includes some soldiers and officers from the United Kingdom.Before heading back to school, the students had their lunch at the sprawling lawns adjacent to India Gate.

### FRENCH LIBRARY

To widen the knowledge of French Language, a visit to the French-Library at Alliance Francaise was organized for Class VIII on 29 September. The students got the opportunity to explore the world of French Language and know about different genre of books available at the French library. Arya Samaj Mandir, Gurudwara Shri Guru Singh Sabha and Mar Gregorios Church on 15 November and 16 November respectively. First stopover was the Arya Samaj Mandir, where the students observed the architecture. The architecture attempted to dissolve the boundaries between human beings and the divine, seeking to underscore the unification with the divine as the ultimate aim. Next students visited Gurudwara Shri Guru Singh Sabha, wherein students meditated for a while and grasped the spiritual power from its surroundings. 


