



The resource person was Mr. Amitabh Pandey, President "S.P.A.C.E." a well-known astronomer and Science communicator whose views are regularly incorporated in print media. The members of the club took part in an interactive session where they asked a variety of questions relating to the possibility of life on other planets. ADOLESCENT AND PSYCHOLOGICAL ISSUES

Our school organized a two-session workshop on 6th of September in which the Principal Ms. A. Aggarwal welcomed the eminent Psychiatrist Dr. Sameer Parikh. The workshop in two phases comprised of-

- An interactive session with the senior staff on the prevailing adolescent issues as well as the various psychological and behavioral problems of the adolescents.
- The second session was primarily for the primary staff on the two major disorders/disabilities.
 - Attention Deficient Hyperactivity Disorder
 - Specific Learning Disabilities in the area of reading, writing and mathematics.

These disabilities are specific in the age group of 3-8 yrs. The main aim of the workshop was to help these children in their classes and evaluate them in order to provide them with remedial education. The teachers were provided with the behavioral checklists for identification of these disorders. The workshop was both interactive and informative.

THE ART OF LIVING

The Guru's of the organisation conducted an Art of Living workshop for the teachers on October 16th and 17th. They introduced us to their basic course, which included Pranyam, meditation, Yoga and many other processes that lead to a fit and healthy body and a calm relaxed mind. At the heart of the course is the Sudarshan Kriya, a powerful yet simple breathing technique that oxygenates each and every cell of the body, eliminates stress and leaves one fresh and energetic. The teachers felt rejenuvated after the workshop and were really keen to take up the course.

MATHS WORKSHOP

On 18th of October our school organized a Mathematics workshop. Dr. S.N. Chibber, Secretary of Delhi Association of Mathematic teachers and Dr. J.C.Nijhawan, District Secretary of Delhi Association of Mathematic teachers, conducted the workshop. Dr. Chibber discussed in detail the changes in the syllabus of Class X and about the new topics introduced. Dr. Nijhawan talked about typical questions from various topics of Class XII. Teachers from 21 schools of Delhi attended this workshop and were enriched by the expertise of the resource persons.


EXCURSIONS


