

Teachers are expected to create learning situations wherein the learner finds out himself. "ANY NEW CHANGE MAKES THE JOB OF A TEACHER A LITTLE MORE CHALLENGING", with these inspiring words Mr. R.P. Sharma began his address. He went on to say "a learning teacher" is more effective than " a learned teacher". The participating teachers had hands on experience of various maths lab activities pertaining to secondary schools.

MATHS ACTIVITIES AT OUR SCHOOL

"If I had these manipulative methods. I would have got 110/100" thus said Mr. A.P.J Abdul Kalam. Hn'ble President of India about the Math Kits introduced by the Ramaanujam Museum and Maths Education Centre, Chennai. A two -day workshop on "Effective Teaching through Maths Lab" was held at India Habitat Centre, New Delhi, which was attended by Ms. Srinivas. on 8 and 9 April 2005. The workshop was conducted by a five member team on various aspects of the Mathematics Curriculum stipulated for classes III-VIII. Mr. Hukum Singh, Professor, NCERT while addressing the gathering of 76 Mathematics teachers from various reputed schools of Delhi and neighbouring areas said, "It is his dream that all schools in India should have a Maths Lab. 'Chalk and talk method' is not enough. Abstract concepts should be verified through activities,". The workshop was interactive and the participating teachers were transported to the world of students and could not help thinking "I wish I was a student now. The teachers went through the stages of the various kits. Thanks to Ramanujam Center. Mathematics teachers have been provided with a platform to express, stimulate and implement ideas and method unique to Mathematics, ' The language of the Universe."




Tanvi Raghuvanshi


