BOARD RESULTS AT A GLANCE

Our Students have done it once again and proved themselves at the Boards by achieving a 100% result in class X and a 99.6% in class XII with 289 and 282 students appearing respectively. In class XII, Sanjay Dhawan of the Science Stream brought laurels to the school by scoring 94.6% and Sagar Nagpal of the same stream carved a niche for himself by scoring a 100% in Maths.


In the Commerce stream (with Maths) Ankita Aggarwal topped with 93.4% and Chandni Rai with 88.4% in Commerce (without Maths). Sakshi Malhotra did the school proud by scoring 87.8% in the Humanities stream.

In class XII we had 88 students who scored distinctions in all 5 subjects. In class X Medha Bansal proved her mettle and topped with a 95.2% closely followed by Mehak Arora 94.8% and Chhavi Trivedi with a 94.2%. Five students Karan Baweja, Rajat Grover, Aanchal Marwaha, Nakul Yadav and Vikas Garg proved their Mathematical genius by scoring a centum in Maths. Karan Baweja also scored a centum in Social Science alongwith Khanak Nangia. 86 students of class XI scored distinctions in all 5 subjects, doing the school proud.



With a number of people to advise and the fear of a wrong decision lurking at the back of one's mind, this time in a student's life is of paramount importance. To ease out this process, a Career Assessment Programme was planned for classes X and XI which was carried out by IMS Learning Resources, a well known Educational Consultancy Agency, in the school premises on 8 April, to orient the students and parents for the same. Ms. Payal Krishnan, Counselling Psychologist from IMS Learning Resources, addressed the audience and explained the need for career assessment, its future implications and procedure.

Following the seminar assessment, counselling sessions were held from 11 July to 13 July 2007, for the students and parents as well, by the Counsellors from IMS Learning Resources. These counseling sessions focused on communicating the results of the assessment done, its implications and helping to ease out the process of decision making for a stream / career. The profiles prepared showed the analysis of the students' interest, aptitude and personality as evident from the assessment. 132 students from classes X and XI participated and were surely benefitted.

The programme ended with feedback, observations and suggestions by the participants. Many small children work in factories and live in very bad conditions. After the session, we wrote our feedback and gave then to the GOONJ volunteers. And then, at 4:00 p.m. we left wiser with empathy in our hearts.
