



CBSE RESULTS - ANOTHER MILESTONE COVERED

Our students have once again done the school proud by achieving a 100% result in the AISSE2008, Akanksha Gupta scored the highest aggregate of 95.4% with Eira Kochhar following closely with 95.2%. Nimisha Sethi stood third with 94.4%.

The following students brought laurels to the school by scoring 100% in Maths-Akanksha Gupta, Eira Kochhar, Mayank Khera, Shubhangi Srivastava, Prabhkaran Singh, Abhijeet Khanna and Parul Jain. In English the highest marks scored were 94% with a score of 98% being the highest in Science. In Social Science, Hindi and Sanskrit the highest marks scored were 99%, 96% and 98% respectively. 120 students scored distinctions in all five subjects. It has really been a wonderful result!

On 23rd May, 2008 the declaration of the Class XIIth Board Result was once again a 100% results in the three streams: Humanities, Science & Commerce. Raashi Khanna scored 86.6% in the Humanities stream and did her school proud. Abhisar Saini topped in the Science stream with 92.6% and beating her peers was Harleen Kaur of the commerce stream who scored 93.6%. There were many distinctions in the various subjects of every stream with 54 students securing distinctions in all five subjects. A major feat indeed in the world of Academics. This feature was honorably manifested by Mudit Kalra who scored 90.2% in the commerce stream and topped the exam in the physically handicapped category.





WORKING FOR A NOBLE CAUSE

A two day interactive programme was held on 28 and 29 August in the school by Goonj, an NGO working for underprivileged children. It was attended by the students of Class V. A special sheet was given to each student to know their views about the village students. Mr. Anshu Gupta, founder of Goonj explained to them the problems and needs of the village students. This was followed by a documentary film that showed the interaction of village students with urban students. It motivated our students to help their rural fellow students by donating clothes, stationery items and inspired them to sponsor mats, skipping ropes, balls, cards, story books, writing pads, etc developed by Goonj out of waste cloth/paper. A competition was also organized to write letters to friends in villages in the form of a poem, drawing or message.

They were duly impressed by the simplicity and neatness of these homes which had all necessary amenities. They were touched by the family bonding between children and their surrogate mothers.

Prerna Niketan Sangh

In April 2008 a contribution of books and notebooks was made by our students, to Prema Niketan Sangh, an NGO which looks after physically challenged children belonging to the poor strata of society.

A group of 15 students of Class IX visited the 'Personality Development Camp' for physically challenged children on 13th May 2008. This was organized by the NGO Prema Niketan Sangh. The students accompanied by their teachers, Ms. M. Parashar & Ms. S. Malik organized a series of activities like art competitions as well as games like Antakshari & Passing the Parcel. The students presented all the children at the camp with hand-made cards with inspiring quotations & small presents like pencil boxes, crayons & steel tiffin boxes. The students also had a fruitful interactive session with children and were very impressed with their positive outlook & their desire to succeed despite the odds. At the end of the visit the students redeemed their pledge to strengthen the ties between St. Mark's and Prema Niketan.

Goonj

Our students extended a helping hand to Goonj, an NGO working for poor and destitute people all over India, by contributing 25 sacks and 4 cartons of material comprising clothes, stationery items, etc for less fortunate rural counterparts. Amen to the feeling of empathy and love which motivates the SMS family - students, faculty and management alike.

A group of students of class VIII attended 'Pratibimb' a rural urban interface event organized by Goonj, on 22.4.2008 at Bapu Samaj Seva Kendra. The students of the school presented a small skit highlighting the importance of literacy and 'Right to Education for All'. They also spoke about a new empowered India led by educated Indians. The students interacted with a number of rural children from different parts of India and satiated their curiosity with regard to problems faced by these rural children.

WORKING FOR 'ANGELS'

A group of students of classes XI and XII, along with teachers Ms. M. Parashar and Ms. S. Malik visited 'Angels' a small initiative run in the slum area of Vikas Puri by Mr. Sylvester. Angels focuses on curricular as well as extracurricular development of about 60 slum children and makes the children aware about basic hygienic practices, academics, personality development and trains the youngsters in soccer. Our students posed a myriad of questions to Mr. Sylvester regarding the problems he faced and the requirements of the students. The young members of Angels greeted our students with love and even presented a small cultural programme. Our school presented them with eco-friendly bags and chocolates and promised to provide all possible help to them. A drive has already taken off to help these less fortunate children.

STUDENTS ATTEND VIPASSANA CAMP

Meditation has become a part and parcel of our curriculum. So, twenty seven boys of classes VIII and IX alongwith three teachers attended a 2-day 'Anapana" course at Vipassana Sadhana Sansthan from 8.8.08 to 10.8.2008. They got to know about the 'Anapana' technique in which a person is able to exercise control and improve concentration by concentrating on his breathing because breath is directly linked with different kinds of emotions that we undergo. It was a very fruitful and enriching experience.

CAREER COUNSELLING WORKSHOP

Ms. M. Mehta, Guidance Counsellor, participated in a Training Programme organized by Eduexcel in collaboration with Pearl School Business on 24.4.2008 at India International Centre. The speakers were Dr. V. S. Ravindran, Counselling Psychologist and Trainer, Dr. Ashutosh Bhupatkar, Prof. Management and Organizational Studies, PSB, Dr. I. M. Pandey, Prof. IIM, Chairman of Academic Council, PSB and Prof. Ashok Sanghi, Management Consultant. The programme focused on the changing trends in education, different types of career options and also covered the topic 'Entrepreneurship - A novel concept in Career Counselling'.

CAREER PLANNING SEMINAR

We organized a Seminar on "Career Planning" conducted by Ms. Payal Krishnan and Ms. Ridhi Makkar from Applect Learning Systems, co-ordinated by Ms. M. Mehta, Guidance Counsellor of the school, on 19.4.2008. The seminar was conducted for students of classes X and XI along with their parents. 

"Luck is a matter of opportunity and preparation meeting at one place".



STUDENTS AT MT. ABU


