CBSE CLASS X RESULT 2014



CBSE CLASS XII RESULT 2014-ANOTHER MILESTONE COVERED

The declaration of Class XII Board result was a moment of joy and pride for all of us. **Kashish Anand** of Commerce stream topped with 97.4%, **Anya Arora** topped in the Science stream with 96.4% and beating his peers was **Prateek Gupta** who scored 89.6% in Commerce without Maths. **Simran Kaur Malhotra** topped with 95.2% in Humanities stream and did her school proud. A total number of 907 distinctions were secured in various subjects of every stream and 97 students secured distinctions in all five subjects. The highlight of the result was **Soumya Sharma** and **Kashish Anand** who scored a perfect hundred in Business Studies. 76 students secured an aggregate of above 90%. The Principal Ms.A. Aggarwal congratulated the students and teachers of the school. We are also proud of our students, **Srishti Jain**, **Lakshay Suri & Anya Arora**, for being eligible for the INSPIRE Awards. 



MATHEMATICS WORKSHOP

An in-service teachers training workshop for Mathematics teachers of classes 6-12 was organized by our school on 16 May 2014. It was conducted by the eminent mathematician Mr. S.N. Chhibber, retired Principal, Directorate of Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, resource person for NCERT, SCERT, (Delhi), CBSE and author of several school text books on mathematics.
