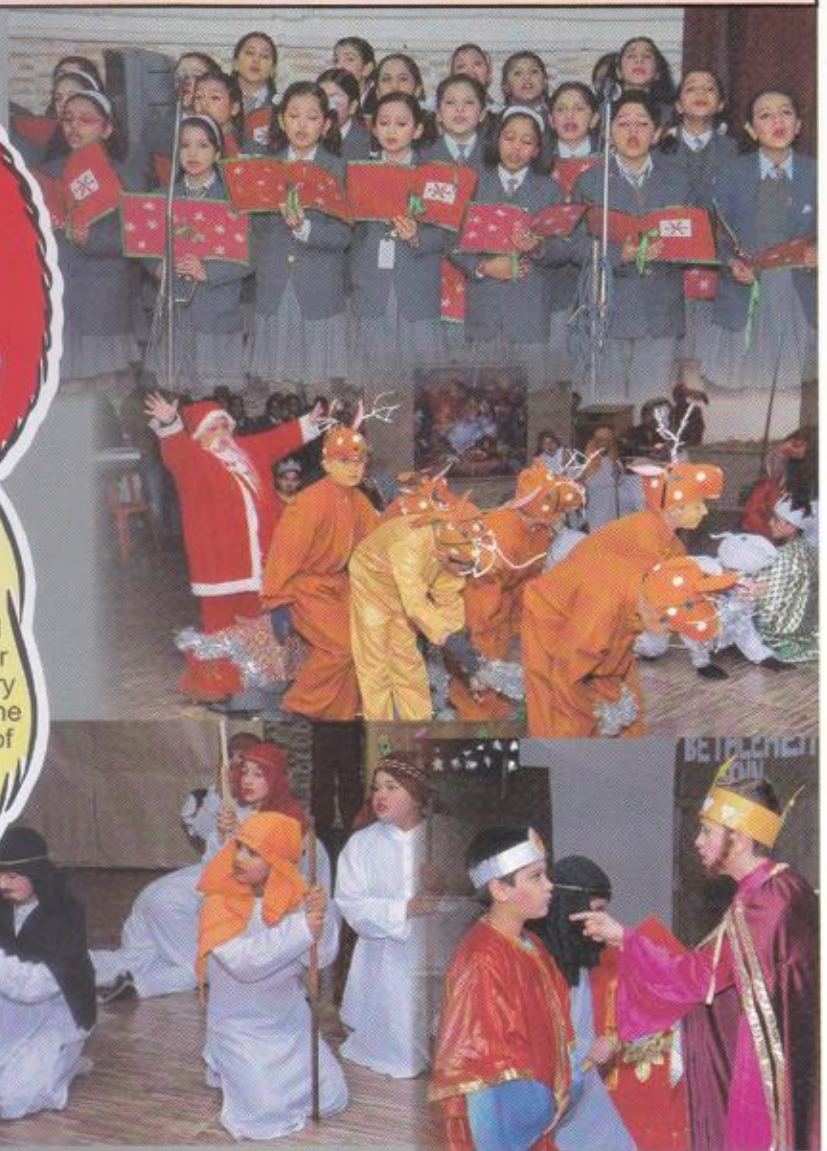
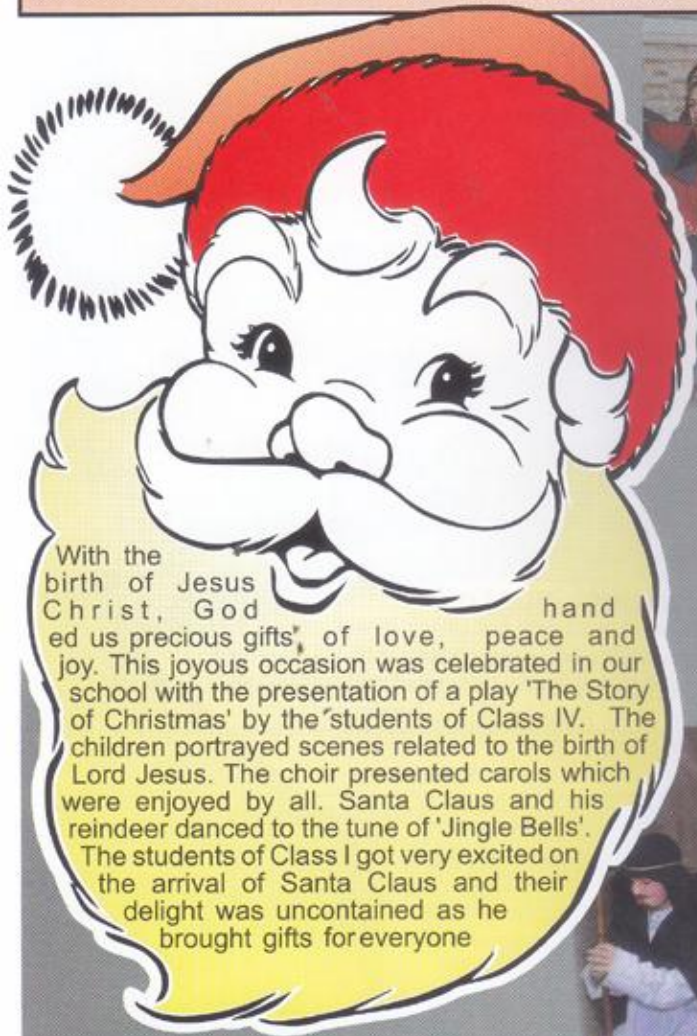

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME



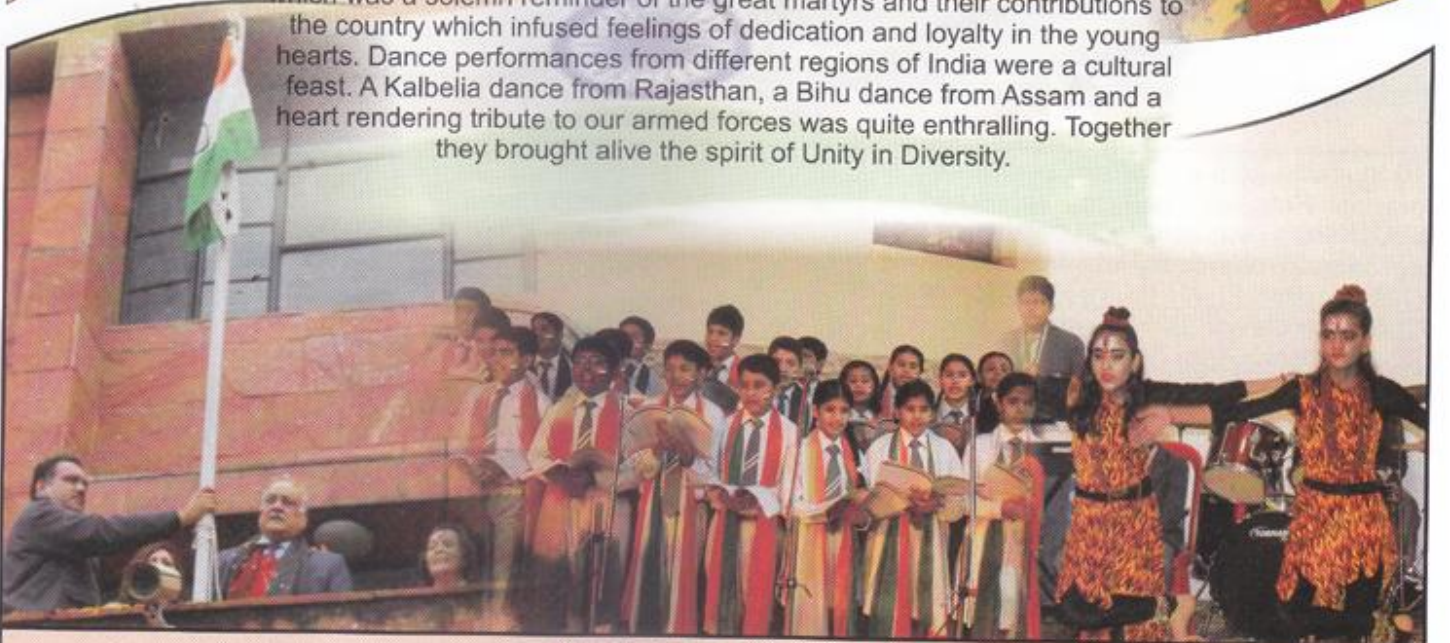

C.B.S.E INCULCATING COUNSELING SKILLS IN TEACHERS

Ms. M. Pathak and Ms. T. Kant attended a Capacity Building Programme on 'Inculcating Counseling Skills in Teachers' organised by C.B.S.E. and conducted by 'Expressions India' on 19 February, 2015. The programme aimed to sensitize teachers for the growing need of comprehensive counseling and equip them with creative approaches in areas of counseling. The workshop was certainly a learning experience as they could understand the need of appropriate counseling therapy.

YOGA WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS

A Yoga workshop was held for the teachers of classes VI to XII on 15 January, 2015. It was taken up by Mr. Saket Gupta, a senior faculty of the Art of Living and the coordinator of YES and Art Excel workshops in Delhi. He talked about various kinds of stress (physical and mental), and how to deal with it effectively using simple exercises, breathing techniques and meditation. Besides explaining the benefits of meditation, he also shared some of the ways to handle difficult students. The simple pranayams and techniques taught were extremely effective. Around 60 teachers attended the workshop. The teachers felt relaxed and rejuvenated after it.

WORKSHOP ON EFFECTIVE SCIENCE TEACHING

A workshop on Effective Science Teaching was conducted on 15 January, 2015 by Dr. Lalit Kishore, who has researched on mastering learning strategy of physics instruction and has done PhD in Education and Masters in Physics. He has been the Director of Jeevan Vigyan Academy, Jain Vishva Bharati. Some of the topics that were discussed were use of textbook as an effective learning aid, language of science, nature of science, visual symbols of science, conceptual pictures of animals using line diagram, how to make science progressive, etc. This was done with the use of blackboard, simple activity using straws and A-4 size sheet of paper. 35 teachers from class I – V and Science teachers of class VI to VIII attended this workshop.

HINDI WORKSHOP

A workshop for 36 teachers teaching Class I to V and Hindi teachers of class VI to X was organised on 15 January, 2015. The workshop was conducted by Dr. Piyush Kumar Sharma, a recipient of Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan Rashtriya Shikshak Samman, 2013. Our school is one of the very few schools in Delhi, that not only participated but also supported the cause of imparting computer Science education to millions of students all across the globe. Students of classes I to XI participated in a plethora of activities such as maze sequence, angry birds, flappy birds and other hour activities.

WORKSHOP ON CYBER CRIME

3 teachers, Mr.N. Gupta, Ms. S. Bhatnagar and Ms.G.Kaur attended a workshop on cyber crime. The resource person was Mr.Rakshit Tandon, a computer security expert who has spoken in major cyber security conferences including those of the United Nations and is the official promoter of the Safer Internet Day. The motive of the workshop was to know about the laws related to Cyber Crime. He discussed about Sections 66 and 67 of Information Technology Act India. The workshop was really enriching as many cyber related crimes done by individuals were cited as examples. Around 70 teachers from various schools of Delhi attended this workshop.

UNITED NATIONS WORKSHOP

Arora and Ms. Rooma, attended a workshop to mark the ongoing 70th Anniversary Year of United Nations and to celebrate the World Wildlife Day organized under aegis of United Nations. SCHOLASTIC CHILDREN'S LITERACY FORUM

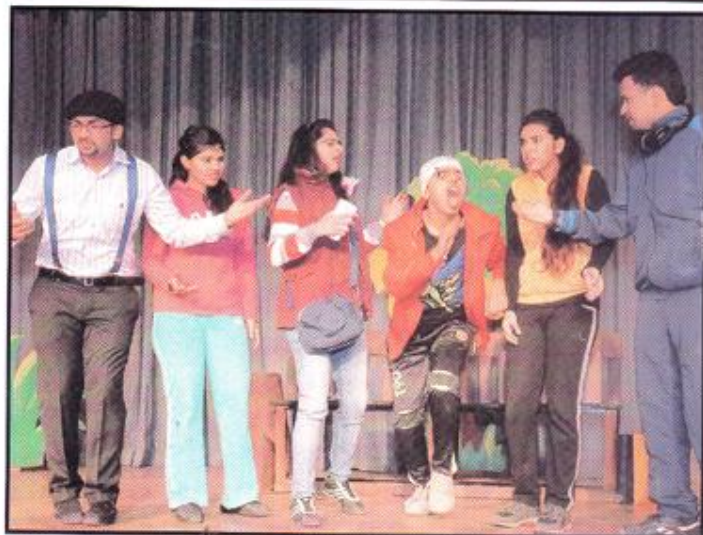

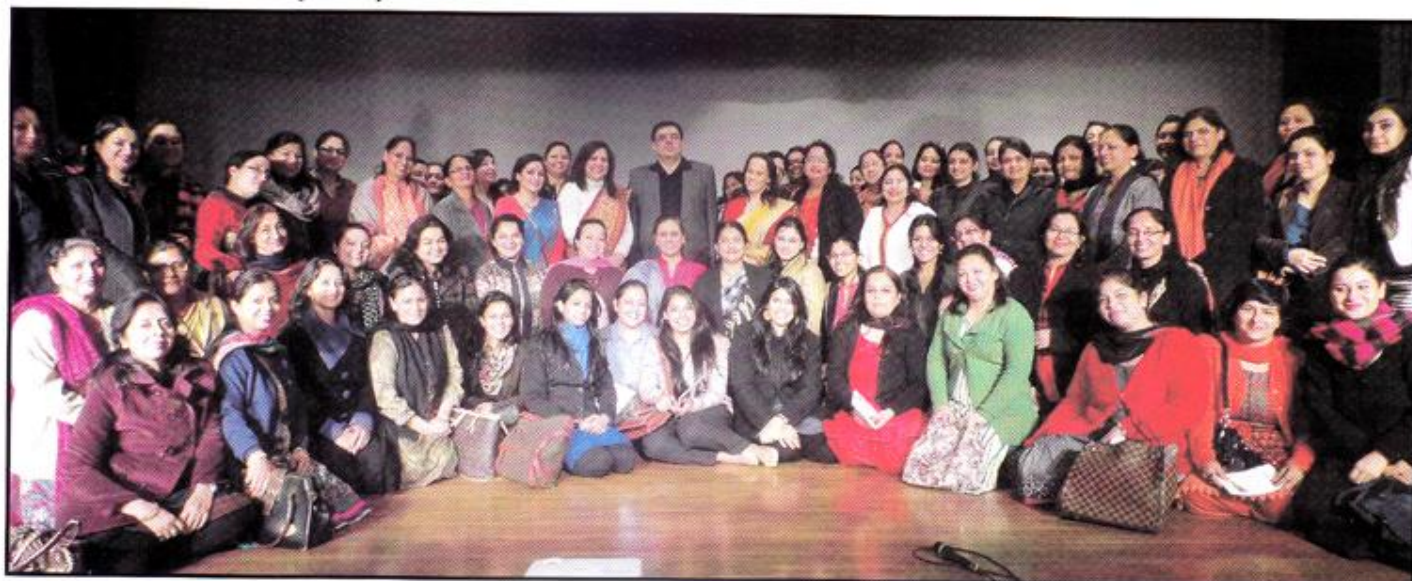

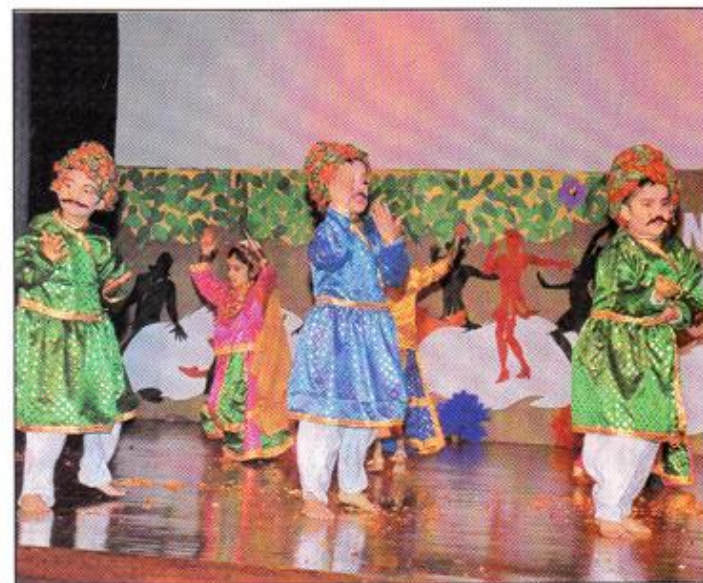
