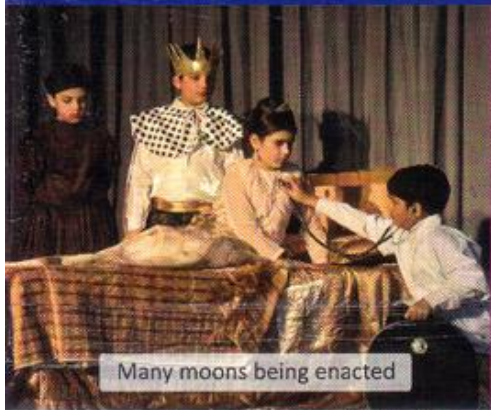
INTER CLASS ENGLISH PLAY COMPETITION

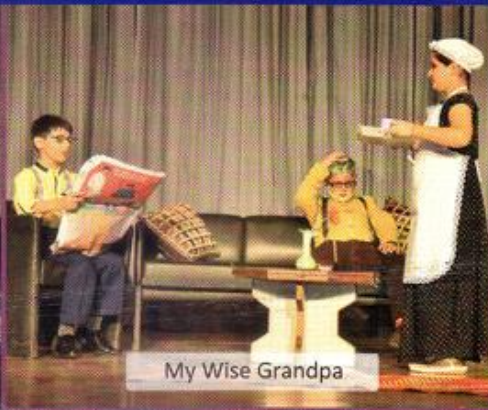

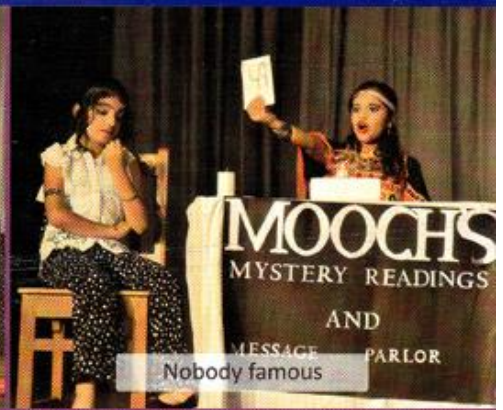

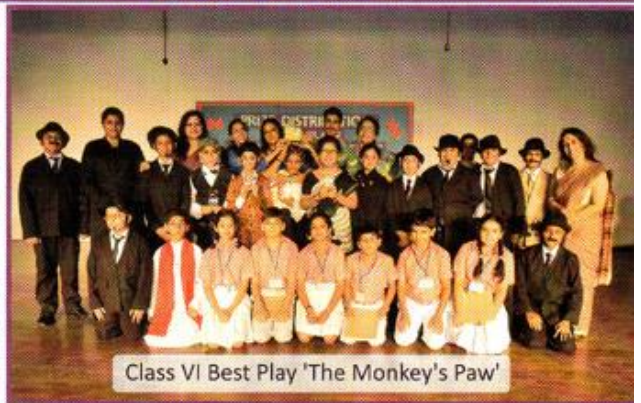

INTER CLASS ENGLISH PLAY COMPETITION

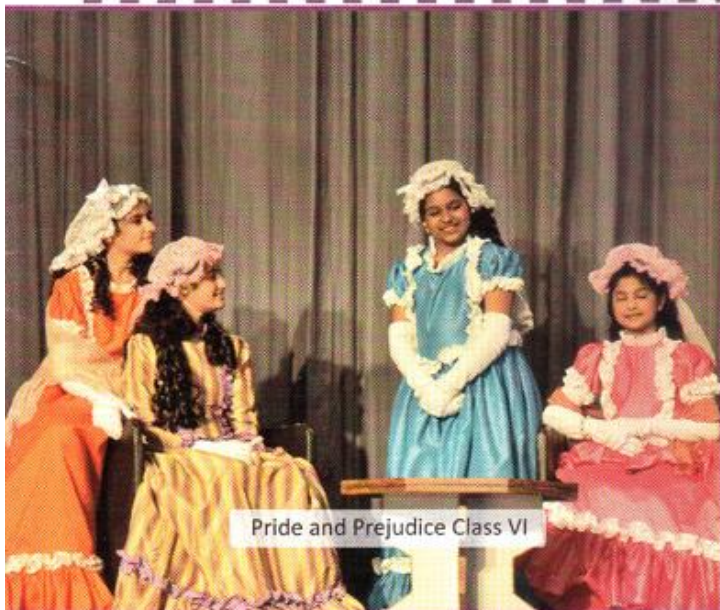

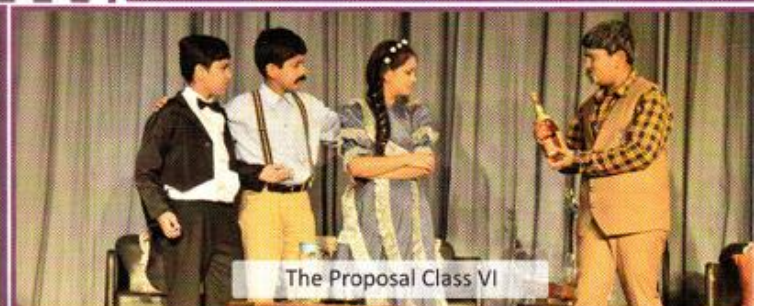

EID – UL – FITR CELEBRATION

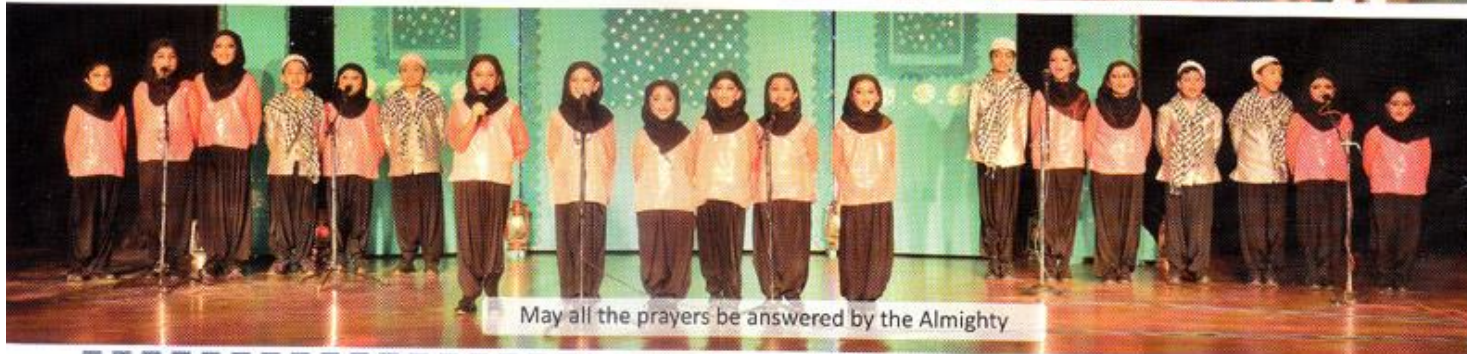

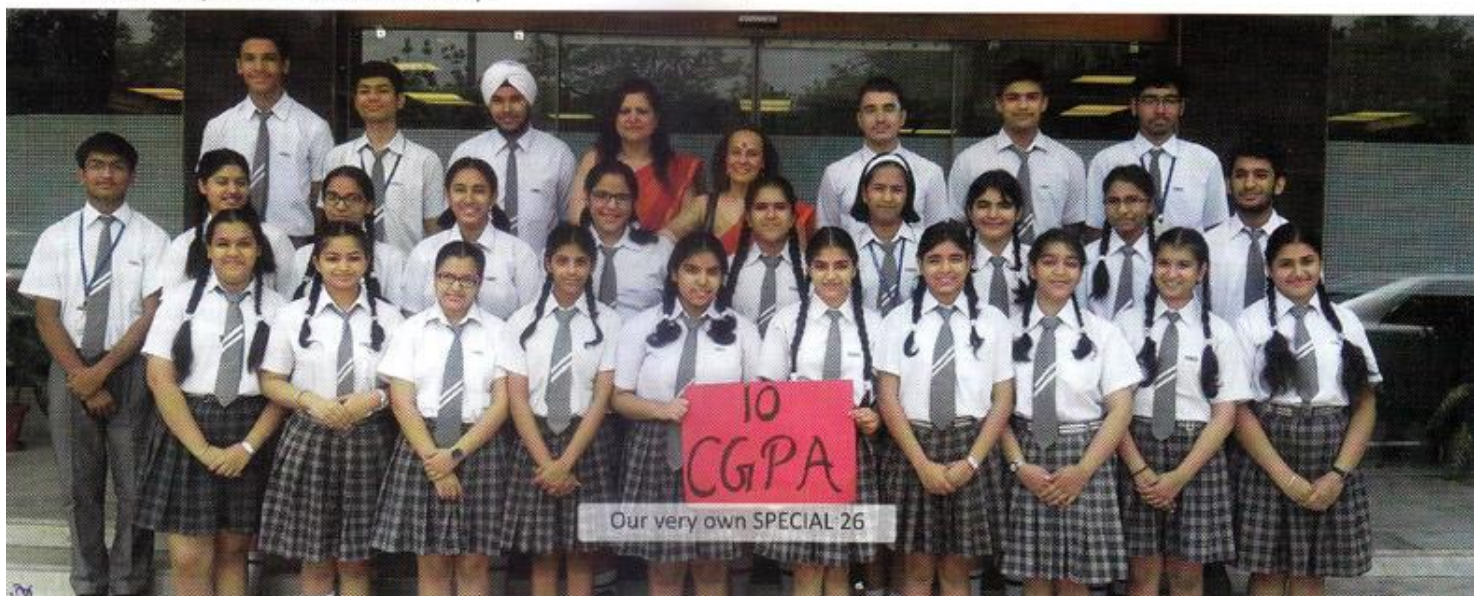
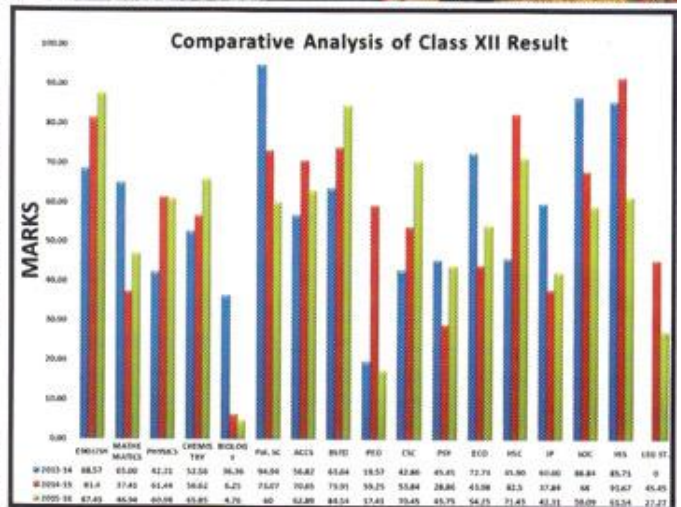


SMS SHINES BRIGHT

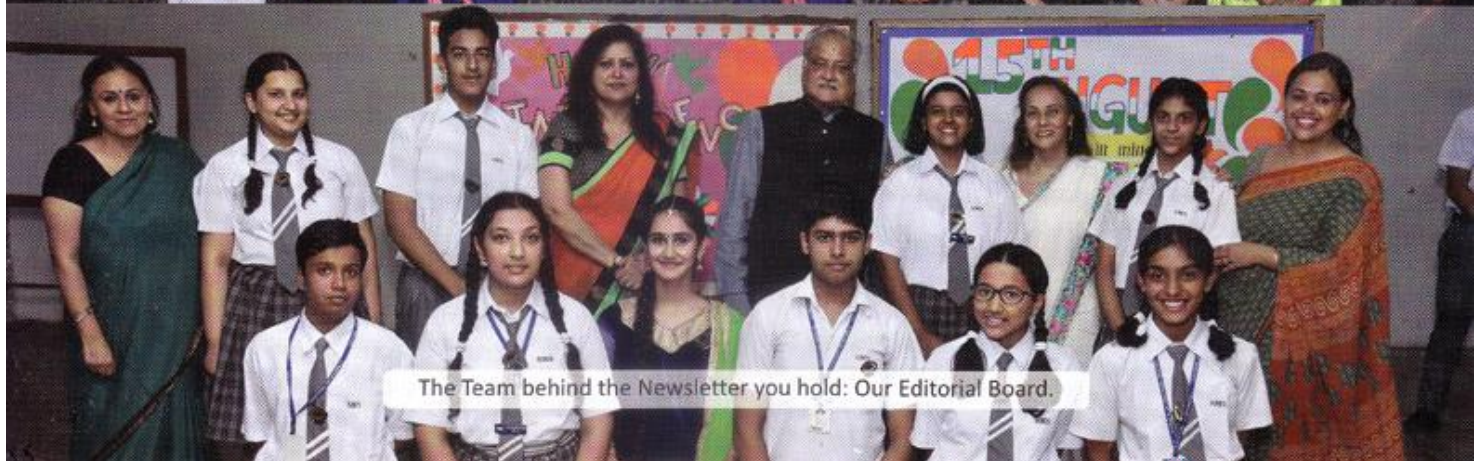
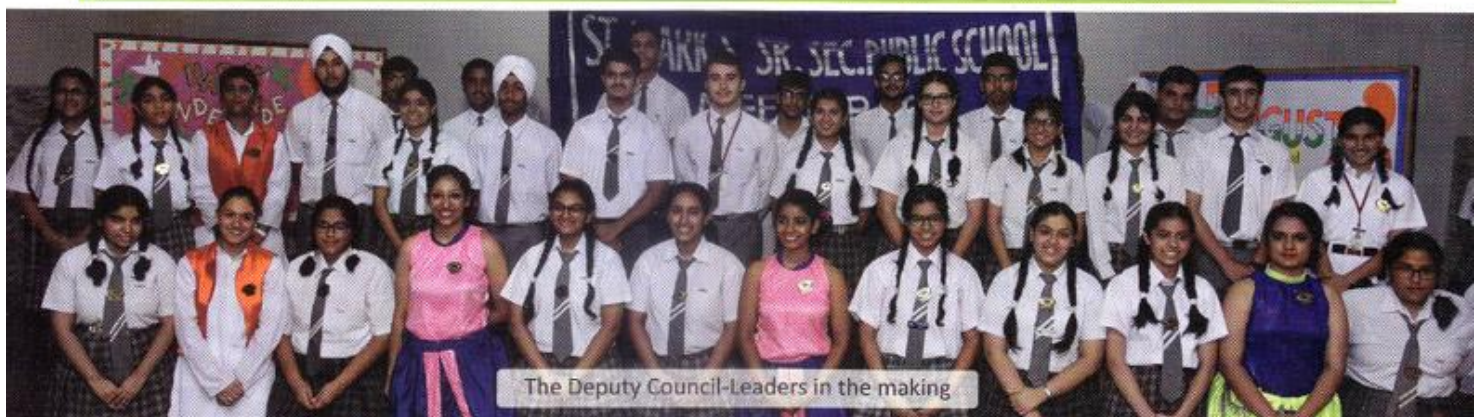


INVESTITURE CEREMONY

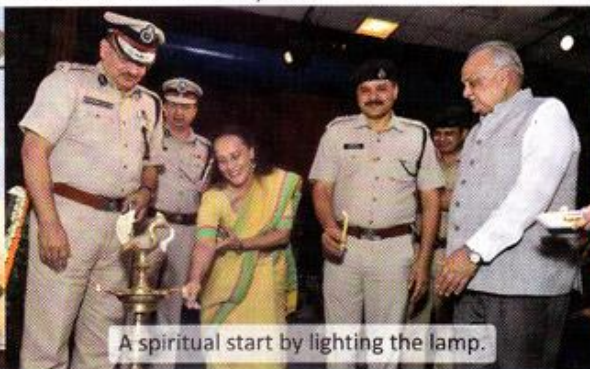

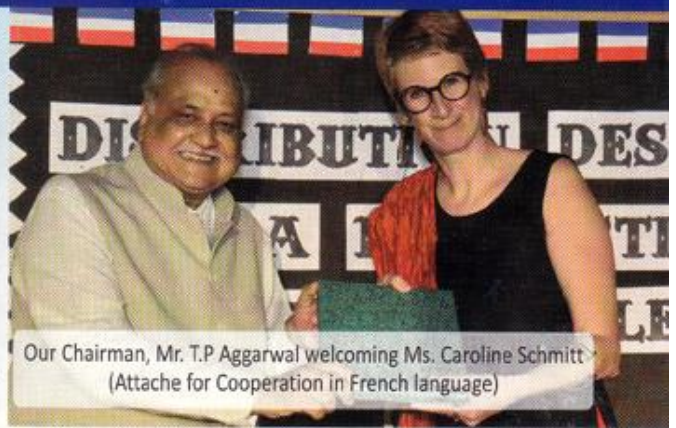

THE LEARNING CURVE

WORKSHOP ON OVERSEAS EDUCATION

DEAKIN UNIVERSITY EVENT

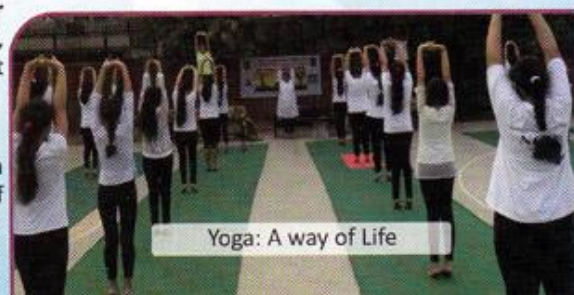

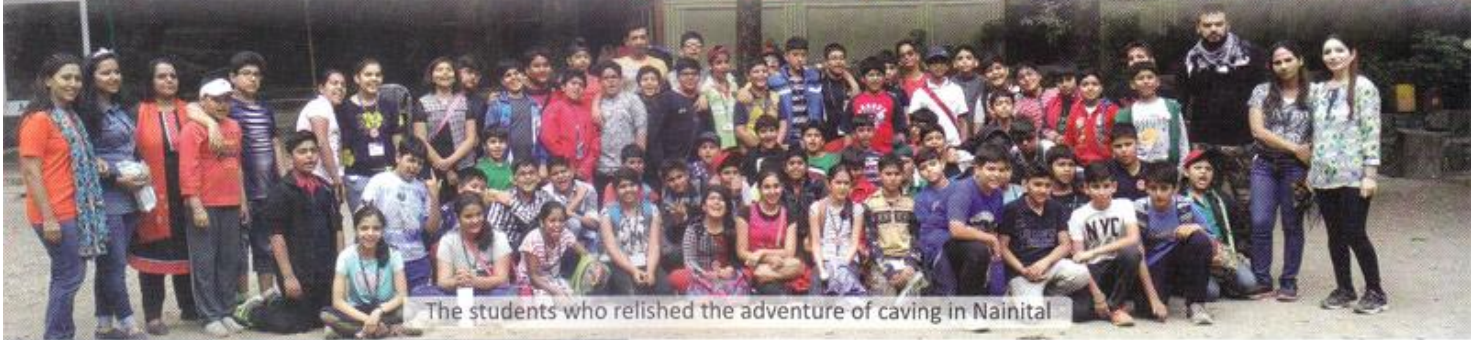
INTERNATIONAL DAY OF YOGA

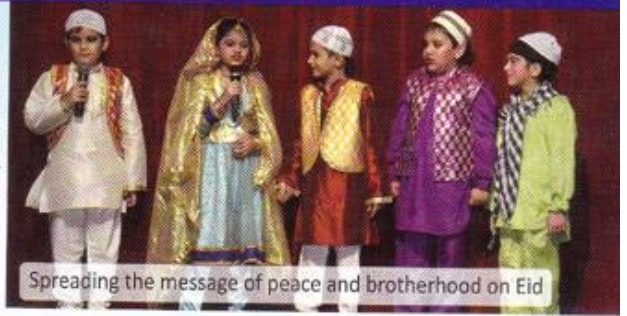
EDUCATIONAL EXCURSION TO THE TRAFFIC TRAINING PARK AND ISKCON TEMPLE

EID – UL – FITR CELEBRATION

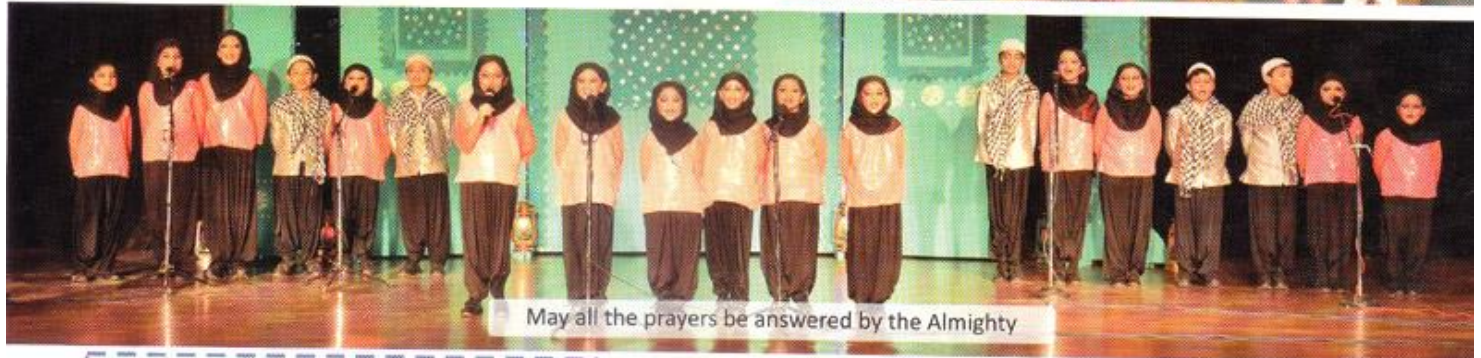

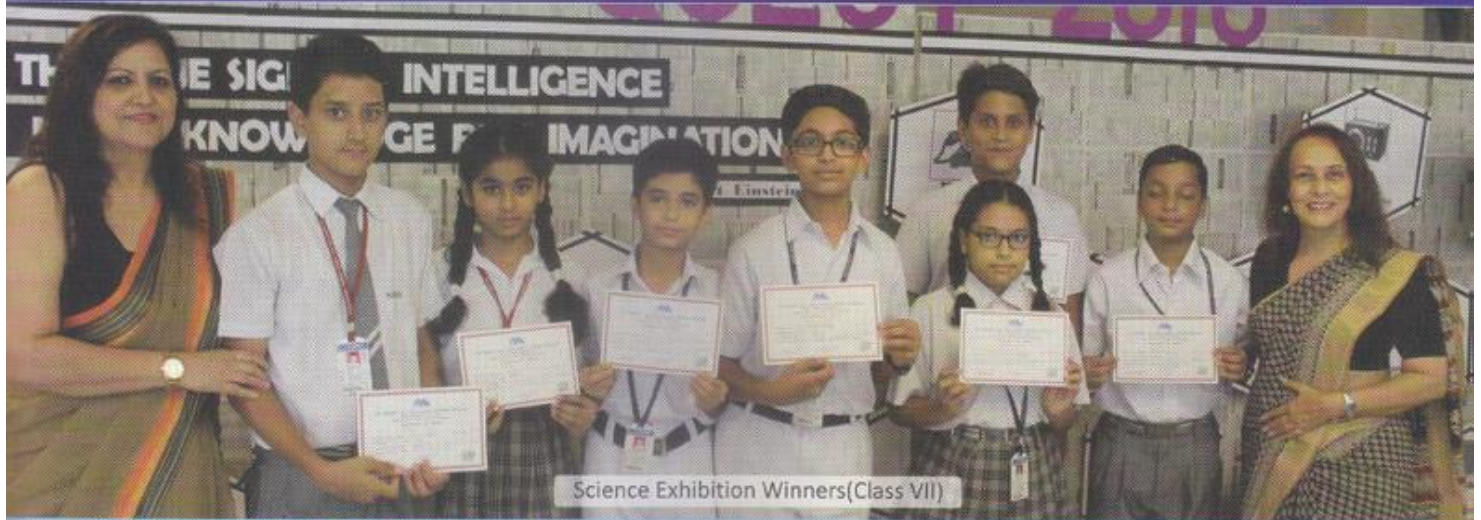


WONDERFUL WEDNESDAYS

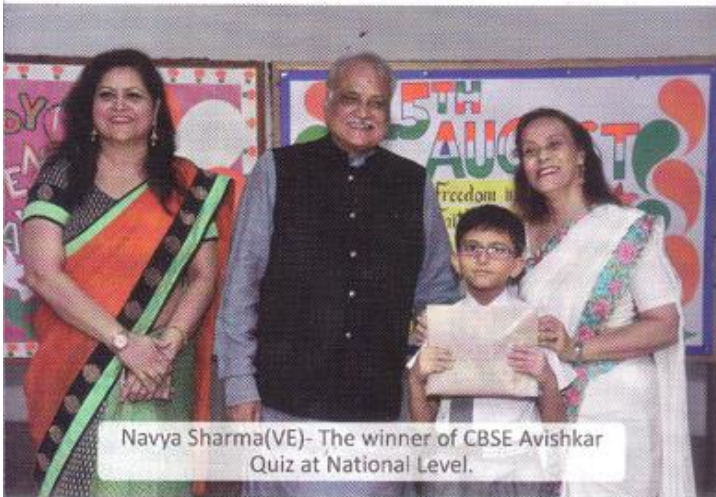

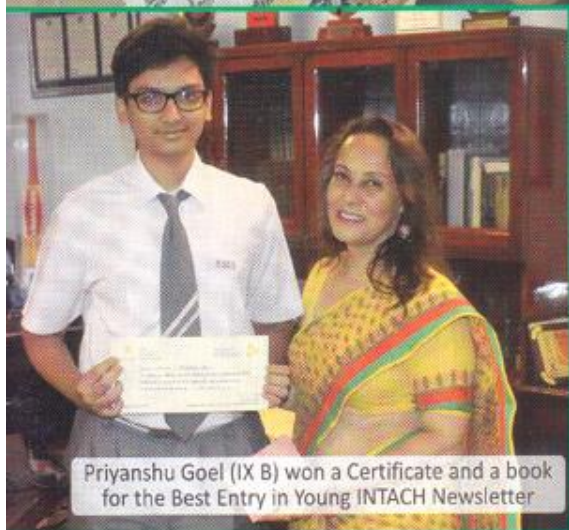

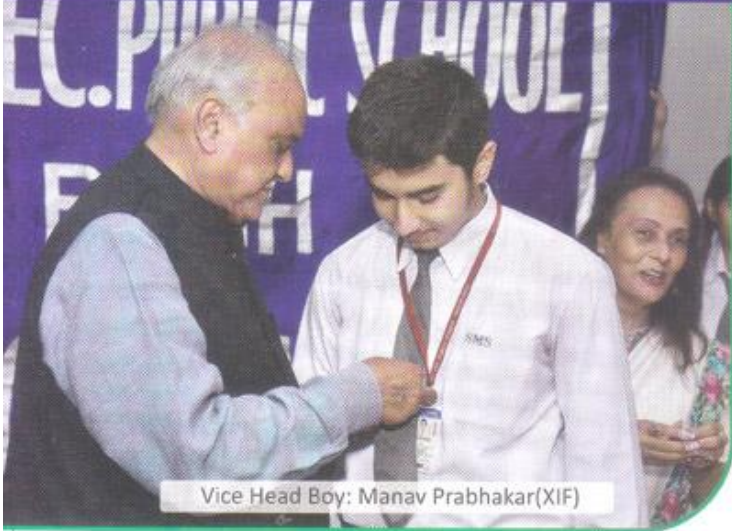

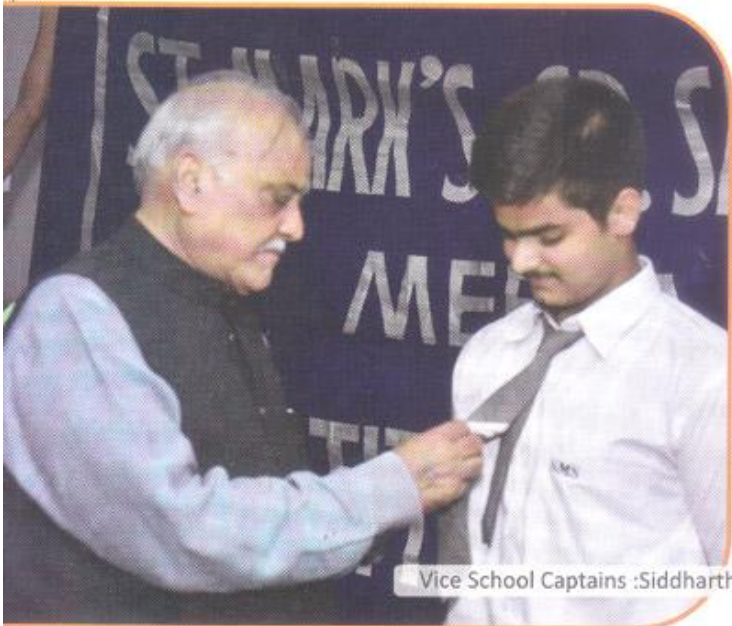

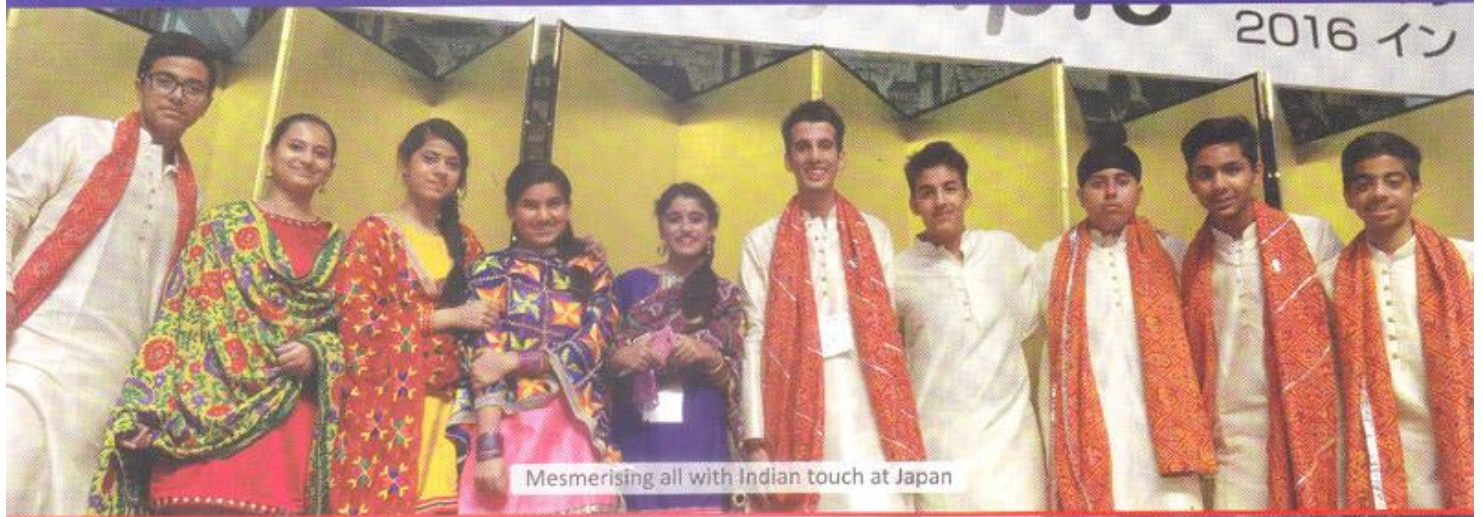

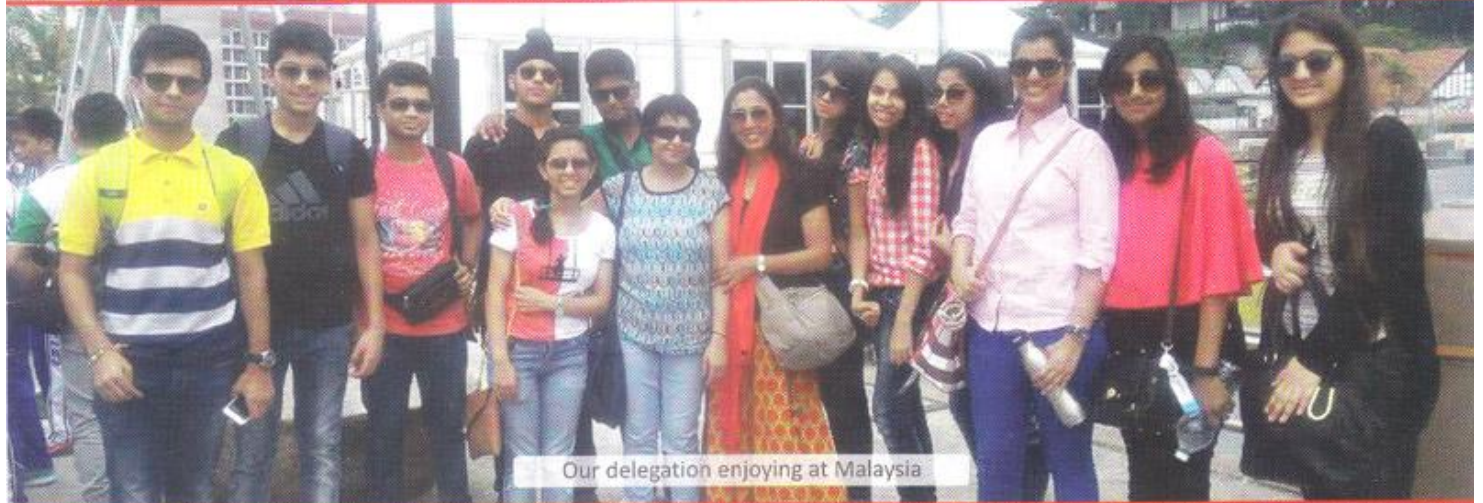
