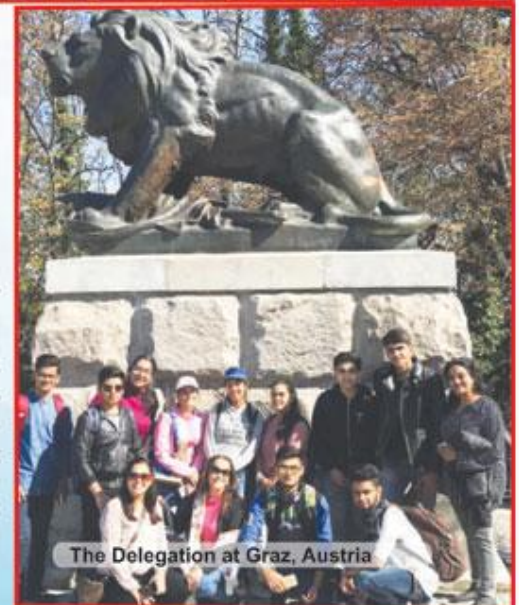

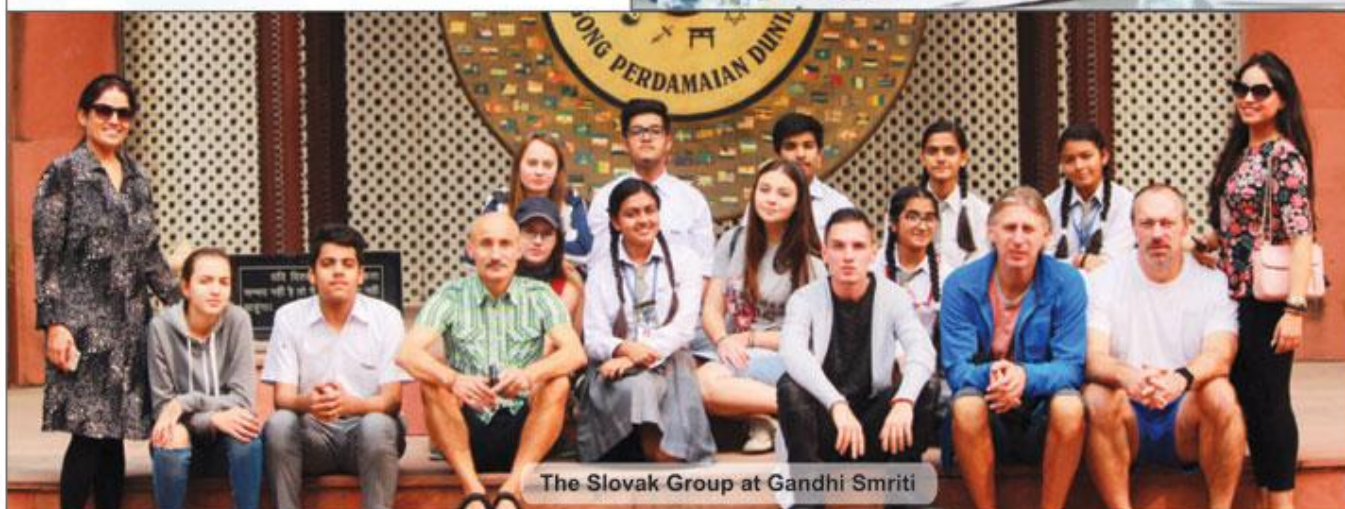
OUR PRINCIPAL -A PANELIST AT AN INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE
