BUDDING ARTISTS



SCHOLASTIC LITERACY PRO WORKSHOP

A Scholastic Literacy Pro Program was conducted by Scholastic India on 19 March 2019 for a group of teachers of classes IV to VIII. The resource persons Ms. Loena Srivastava and Ms. Rachana talked about how important it is for students to develop their reading skills. They also gave details as to how Lexile leveling works.

Lexile measures are based on over 30 years of research and are the most widely adopted measure of reading ability and text difficulty. Lexile measures help educators and students select books at a level that will challenge them - not so difficult as to be frustrating, but difficult enough to encourage reading growth. The teachers were made aware of the Scholastic Literacy Pro which is a research-based, online assessment resource that provides teachers with evidence-based data so they are informed when making teaching/learning decisions to develop their students into successful, proficient readers.


THEATRE AND DANCE WORKSHOP




ANNUAL PICNICS
