#### INDO-GERMAN STUDENT EXCHANGE



#### KLOSTERCHULE ROSSLEBEN

Student exchange programmes propel learning, knowledge enhancement, personality development and acceptance of crosscultural perspectives. With this objective, a 10 member delegation comprising of eight students, Geetika Singh (VIIIC), Teghpreet Singh Puri (VIII D), Bhavishya Mishra (VIIIC), Khushi Gupta (IX A), Anmol Gosain (XB), Suvansh Bhatia (XI B), Sharan Vaid (XIE), Sarthak Jain (XIE) and two teachers, Ms. T. Kant and Ms. A. Vohra, visited Germany from 25 September to 4 October, 2019. The delegation was warmly welcomed by the Principal, Mr. Gernot Groeppler, teachers and host families at Klosterchule Rossleben.

During their stay, students attended lessons with their German partners, participated in group discussions about the Purpose of Exchange Programmes and the Role of Art in Education. On the day of formal exchange, the Principal welcomed the group and spoke about the long association between the two schools. Our students gave presentations on India and our school, followed by a Bharatanatyam performance by Khushi Gupta and a patriotic dance performance by the group. The programme ended with a formal exchange of mementos.

The students visited Weimar and other places of historical and cultural importance with their hosts and 2 students went for a camping trip to the Harz mountains, the land of German fairytales, with other German students. During the last four days of the trip the team got a chance to enjoy day trips to the city of Heidelberg and Cologne. They also enjoyed a river cruise and Germany's reunification celebration in Frankfurt.
